"Where flowers bloom, so does hope." -Lady Bird Johnson For nearly a century, the Junior League of Houston has carried out its mission to promote voluntarism, develop the potential of women, and improve communities through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. It is with great pride and gratitude that we present the 2019 – 2020 Annual Report as we share this year's accomplishments.

With a membership 4,500 strong, the Junior League of Houston encourages voluntarism; mentoring and leadership development; and promotes a lifetime of civic service for tens of thousands of women. During the year, League members provided 120,000 volunteer hours in 35 community projects that touched countless lives across our great city. The Junior League of Houston contributed in excess of \$816,000 in grants and project support to a number of deserving organizations throughout the Houston community.

The Junior League of Houston would not be able to give back to the community and train its members without the continued support of generous donors. The League had six Community Partners, who each donated \$20,000 or more to help maintain and further the League's efforts. Additionally, underwriters of the 72nd Annual Charity Ball, Secret Garden, helped raise \$800,000 in support of League efforts. Donors to our League Legends Annual Fund contributed more than \$120,000 to support the community efforts, building preservation and operating expenses of the League. Continuing thanks is due to all those who visited the Junior League Pantry to purchase fresh food items; attended a Tea Room special event; or hosted a meeting, wedding or other event in our beautiful building.

The 2019 – 2020 League year was notable for so many wonderful reasons: events for the year had members and supporters gathering in joyful celebration for Charity Ball, Tea Room and Sustainer Events and engaging in hands-on, in-person activities to serve our community.

By the spring of 2020, group photos felt like a distant memory as our community entered a period of quarantine and isolation. In the wake of stay-at-home orders and social distancing guidelines related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the League's way of serving our members and our community changed, but the relevancy of the League's mission remained constant. As our community, and our world, navigated unprecedented circumstances, the spirit of voluntarism was needed more than ever. Empowered League leaders stepped up to guide our members and our community with grace and compassion. This Annual Report celebrates the impact of the League's volunteer service and leadership training, and its innate ability to build stronger communities... during the good times and in the midst of challenging circumstances.

As COVID-19 expanded its reach, the League's efforts focused on supporting Houston's basic needs, providing valuable community resources, and boosting member and community morale. The work of our leaders and volunteers was nothing short of remarkable. Altruism, social change and civic leadership are at the heart of what the Junior League of Houston stands for and 2019 – 2020 was no exception. This experience showed us all something so valuable...the importance of connection that the League gives its members to each other and to our Community, whether we are physically together or connected in a shared spirit and a shared mission.

2019-2020 COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE GRANTS

Each year, The Junior League of Houston, Inc. provides Community Assistance Grants to worthwhile organizations that do not receive ongoing volunteer support or financial assistance through the League's Community Projects. The League's Community Assistance Committee reviews the grant requests based on their alignment with member-determined impact areas and conducts site visits before making recommendations for funding. When selecting recipients, the committee considers whether an agency request would address a critical or basic need, fund a pilot project or expand a significant service to the community.

Community Assistance Grants are funded, in part, by the Barbara and Roy Adams Endowed Community Grant Fund held by the Junior League of Houston Foundation. This endowed fund was made possible through a generous estate gift from Barbara Beardmore Adams (1940 – 2014), a Junior League member from 1982 - 2014. The 2019 - 2020 fiscal year is the inaugural year of distribution for this endowed fund that focuses on children's health and well-being initiatives and literacy/education enrichment.

The 2019 - 2020 Community Assistance Committee reviewed funding requests from over 80 agencies. The following 12 agencies were awarded a total of \$125,000 in funding. A reception and check presentation occurred on Monday, January 27, 2020.



CHERISH OUR CHILDREN | \$15,000

Cherish Our Children exists to end the multigenerational cycle of incarceration. League funds were used to build infrastructure for the No More Victims program, a course elective offered to children of incarcerated parents who attend Worthing, Sterling and Furr high schools. The classes offer facilitated, peer-supported sessions which create a trusting and safe environment for students.





CHILDREN AT RISK | \$4,000

Children At Risk is a research and advocacy nonprofit focused on children's health, safety, education and economic security. League funds are to expand and provide support for Human Trafficking Awareness Tours to raise awareness of the prevalence of trafficking in our community.





CLOTHED BY FAITH | \$10,000

Clothed By Faith aims to demonstrate God's love by providing clothing to those in need. League funds provided for a week-long supply of gently used clothing, shoes, socks and underwear for 500 Houston-area children in need.



HARRISHEALTH

HARRIS COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT* | \$10,000

Harris County Hospital District owns and operates three hospitals and numerous clinics throughout the county. League funds were used to purchase new books for the Harris Health System's Reach Out and Read program. The books will be distributed to children at well-visit checkups at Harris Health's three Pediatric and Adolescent Health Centers: Bear Creek, C.E. Odom and Pasadena.





HIS GRACE FOUNDATION | \$8,000

His Grace Foundation provides physical, emotional and financial support for the patients and families on the Bone Marrow Transplant Unit (BMTU) of Texas Children's Hospital. League funds help provide a seven-week summer academic enrichment program for patients and their siblings.





HOUSTON: REVISION | \$8,000

Houston:reVision works to break the cycle of isolation among the most profoundly disconnected youth that are in the juvenile justice system. League funds supported the one-time purchase of kitchen equipment and supplies for the revision Community Center in the Gulfton/Sharpstown neighborhood.



MISSION OF YAHWEH | \$19,000

The Mission of Yahweh is focused on ending the cycle of homelessness and dependency. League funds helped pilot the Kreative Kingdom Clubs, a year-round, after-school education program for school-aged children at their campus. Activities will include cooking, arts, music sports, science and drama.





NEHEMIAH CENTER, INC. | \$20,000

The Nehemiah Center, Inc. provides assistance to low income families who are invested in seeking a better future for their children through education, emotional wellness and spiritual enrichment. League funds provided support to the Food Program at Nehemiah, located in downtown Houston, which serves breakfast, lunch and dinner to more than 180 children each day.





OPERATION HOMEFRONT | \$5,000

Operation Homefront's mission is to build strong, stable and secure military families so they can thrive - not simply struggle to get by - in the communities that they work so hard to protect. League funds provided approximately 350 military children with backpacks filled with school supplies for the 2020 - 2021 school year. The supplies will be distributed through Back-to-School Brigade events.





SOCIAL MOTION SKILLS, INC.* | \$10,000

Social Motion Skills, Inc. exists to inspire and empower individuals with autism and similar special needs to achieve their full potential. League funds were used to expand social skills classes to pre-K and kindergarten-age children with autism at Social Motion Skills' center in the Spring Valley area of Spring Branch and at Texas Children's Hospital's Meyer Center for Developmental Pediatrics.





THE WAY HOME ADOPTION, INC. | \$10,000

The Way Home Adoption provides adoption recruitment and matching services focused on older youth in foster care. League funds helped to implement a new program, "Enrich and Engage," that provides 10 events throughout the year to allow older children and prospective adoptive families to meet and interact in a less formal setting.





Young Audiences' mission is to inspire young people and expand their learning through the arts. League funds went towards a pilot program at Harper Disciplinary Alternative Education Program and Crossroads Alternative, two campuses that serve children from 6th to 12th grades. The year-round program teaches self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills and responsible decision-making using arts-integration training and support while also offering prevocational skills training.







CONTINUING TO BUILD A BETTER COMMUNITY

DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

In March 2020, the COVID-19 virus began to spread across the United States, leading several cities and states to enact stay-at-home orders for several weeks. While a number of the Junior League of Houston community placements were temporarily halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the League rallied to continue to support the Houston community, as well as its own members, in several ways. How the League took action during the pandemic:

VOLUNTEERS IN MOTION

- Wrote notes to families staying at Ronald McDonald House Houston
- Purchased critically needed items for BEAR... Be A Resource for CPS Kids and
- Decorated lunch bags and packed lunch kits at home for Kids' Meals
- · Donated personal protective equipment or medical equipment and recorded thank you messages to healthcare workers for Project C.U.R.E.
- Volunteered in small shifts to support the Houston Food Bank, Kids' Meals and Books Between Kids
- The Sing Along with Seniors placement filmed videos and assembled activity book care packages to share with senior centers in the Houston community.
- JLH Emeritus Member Check-In League members made phone calls to check in with all 340 of the League's Sustainer Emeritus members (80-plus year-old League members) during the local stay-at-home order.

MEMBERSHIP ENGAGEMENT

- Several virtual events, including a virtual dance party to help members stay connected
- All trainings and council meetings moved to a virtual format
- The May General Meeting, including the passing of the gavel, was recorded, uploaded to YouTube video and sent out to all members to watch remotely.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

At the last Board of Directors Meeting of 2019 – 2020, the Board approved \$47,000 in community program funds to be dispersed to the Houston community for COVID-19 related relief, which included:

- \$25,000 Kids' Meals of Houston to help them feed nearly 7,500 children a day
- \$9,000 BEAR (Be A Resource for CPS Kids)
- \$6,500 Baylor Teen Health Clinic to provide diapers and wipes to mothers
- \$6,500 Star of Hope to help alleviate food insecurity for women and children

FROM THE LEAGUE KITCHEN

- The Pantry offered a variety of fresh and delicious meals for purchase to the community as area grocery stores saw long lines and shortages of many items. A to-go Easter meal was offered for the first time ever.
- Volunteers from the Ronald McDonald House Houston and Casa De Esperanza House of Hope placement delivered meals on behalf of the League to residents.
- In honor of Mother's Day, the League delivered breakfast bundles from The Pantry to healthcare heroes at The Woman's Hospital of Texas, a community partner.

During what was a most daunting and uncertain time, League members rose to the challenge by finding creative and innovative ways to continue providing support to the Houston community.

UNDERWOOD ROOM REDESIGN REVEAL



The Catherine Fondren Underwood room was given a fresh, new look after more than 30 years. The Underwood room, as it is known to League members, is just inside the main entrance of the League building.


This multi-year project was executed under the watchful eye of 2019 – 2020 Building Chairman Megan A. Ryan and the League's House Committee.

When the current building opened its doors April 1, 1986, under JLH President Anne Tucker, the furnishings from the Underwood Room in the previous building were moved into the new double-parlor Underwood Room. "The design was intended to reflect welcome, comfort and a standard of excellence in place and organization. We are so fortunate to have had such generosity from the Underwood family," says Anne.

The House Committee reviewed multiple design schemes from Wells Design which included the wall coverings, drapery, ceiling accents, and fabrics that are now in place. The existing furniture had served members and guests well for many years, and the House Committee thoughtfully preserved it for continued use by reupholstering with beautiful fabric and trims carefully selected by Wells Design. Only two new pieces of furniture appear in the remodel - the ottomans in front of the fireplaces.

There are two new features of the room that are unique to the League. First are the new rugs, which were handwoven in Nepal based on a sketch by Jerry Jeanmard of Wells Design. Second is the wallcovering—silk panels by de Gournay that were hand painted in Hong Kong with colors carefully selected by the design team to complement the room's fabrics and trims. The "new" Underwood room will continue to serve the League as a welcoming space for members and visitors alike for years to come.







COMMUNITY OUTREACH EVENTS 2019 - 2020

There were several Family-Friendly Community Outreach Events Focused on Children & Education during the League year.
